All the Strips and Curves designs as well as the many Bargello type quilts. Exploring color and texture that are so vital to the success of these techniques. The simple procedure of strips piecing and counter cutting, whether with curves or straight lines can make you become a great stripper as well!

Quilting Demonstration

The Chimayo Valley quilters demonstrate and discuss how to make babyquilts. The simple block construction highlights diverse quilting techniques including appliqué, embroidery and traditional patterns. All use recycled fabric scraps and include the child's name and date of birth. The quilts are filled with polyester batting, backed with pinwhale corduroy and tied with colorful yarn. Instructions for making baby quilts will be available during the demonstration. By Museum admission, New Mexico residents FREE on Sundays!
