"Moving Up and Out: New Directions in Fiber Art" is the talk that will be given by Lauren Camp, our guest speaker on August 25, at 7 p.m. at the White Rock Baptist Church. Following a brief stint of nonprofit work and freelance writing, Lauren devoted herself fully to visual art and poetry. In the past 13 years, Lauren's innovative, award-winning pieces have been in major publications and exhibited at performance spaces, on movie sets, and in

cultural centers and museums in the U.S. and Europe. <u>"The Fabric of Jazz,"</u> her series of jazz portraits, toured museums in ten U.S. cities between 2004 and 2007. Her newest body of work is a multimedia installation featuring sound, sculpture and fiber art. This series, <u>"Flinch: A Study of Your Self,"</u> was on exhibit at the <u>Harwood Art Center</u> in Albuquerque, NM during March 2009. Heather Thomas from Colorado will talk on Know Your Stuff; a power point presentation showing lots of cutting edge new products and techniques available for today's modern quilt maker including but not limited to: Angelina, Crystalina and Textiva film, fabric foil, Fiber Etch, Sequins, Wool Beads, Charms, Miniature glass bead, silk hankies, lutradur, Jacquard and Shiva fabric paints, stenciling and rubbing paint on fabric, Transfer Artist Paper and other photo transfer products, fine metal and mesh, silk petals, silk rods and cocoons, needle felting and more.

Heather will also be doing a workshop for us on <u>Monday September 21</u>, the day <u>before</u> our meeting on Fiber Art Embellishment. Come and explore some of the wonderful products that can be used to embellish the surface of your quilts, dolls and fiber arts. You will make a small wall quilt as you learn to use fabric paints and rubber stamps, Angelina, Crystalina and Textiva, fabric foils and glitters, miniature glass bead and sequins and hot fix metals and crystals. 
