April 2010 Guild Meeting: Stash Buster Night

Tuesday, April 27, 7 p.m. United Church, LA

The program for the guild meeting on the evening of Tuesday, April 27, will be to work on community service projects. You will have several choices to contribute your time and talents. Common to all the projects, however, is the goal to use as much of the guild fabric stash as we can, **so please do not bring any fabric**.

The guild fabric will be spread out on tables and the first step for all the projects will be to select fabrics. Marian Kirchner has planned a new quilt pattern for us, so two of the choices would be to either bring your sewing machine and begin sewing the quilt blocks at the meeting or you can just cut the fabric strips and then take them home to complete the quilt, either by yourself or with a group of fellow quilters. Finished quilts can then be part of your show-and-tell before they are donated.

For those of you who would prefer a smaller project, another choice will be to sew pillowcases for the "1 Million Pillowcase Challenge" sponsored by American Patchwork & Quilting. Patterns for the pillowcases will be available at the meeting. Margaret Hendricks has volunteered to collect the completed pillowcases, both at the meeting and after the meeting, and to enter the number of pillowcases at the challenge's official website:

Which ever choice you would like to make, please bring cutting tools: rotary cutter, ruler and cutting mat. If you'd also like to sew on either Marian's quilt pattern or the "1 Million Pillowcase Challenge," please bring your sewing machine with the usual sewing aids. At least 3 irons will be available.

<u>There will not be a workshop for April</u>, but another session may be planned to continue work on these service projects.

Las Colcheras Quilt Guild presents a Quilt Challenge: By George!

The theme of this challenge, By George, presents the exciting possibility for a wide variety of interpretations inspired by fabric from the George Mendoza Collection, first unveiled at the 2009 International Quilt Market in Houston. George Mendoza, a well-known Las Cruces artist, is becoming a friend of quilters everywhere through his fascinating fabric.

The Challenge will end on January 29, 2011. It will be judged by an NQA Certified Judge and then exhibited at a Las Cruces venue during the month of February 2011.

Challenge Rules:

- 1. Residents of New Mexico and El Paso County are eligible.
- 2. A challenge kit must be purchased (\$10 for LCQG members, \$15 for all others). The challenge kit will contain the two challenge fabrics. The purchase price includes the quilt's entry into the collection's exhibit. Make check payable to LCQG and mail to: LCQG, Box 15181, Las Cruces, NM 88004.
- 3. A recognizable amount of each fabric must be used in the quilt. Any number of additional fabrics may be used.
- 4. The size of the quilt must be: no side smaller than 24" nor larger than 50".
- 5. The quilt may be pieced, appliquéd, embroidered, embellished or any combination of techniques. It may be hand or machine quilted or both and the stitches must be visible on the back of the quilt.
- 6. The quilt must have a 4" sleeve on the back. No entries with frames or glass will be accepted. If special hanging devices are required, prior approval is required.
- 7. The label on the back must include the name of the guilt and the name of the guilter.
- 8. The quilt must be the original work of one person only, and only one entry per person is allowed.
- 9. The artist's statement relating the quilt to the theme must accompany the quilt on an entry form that will be forwarded to you by December 15, 2010. The form will include information about in-person and by-mail Quilt Entry.
- 10. As it is important to the exhibit venue, December 15, 2010, is an opt-out date. If you have purchased a kit, you will be contacted at that time to confirm that you will be entering a quilt. There will be no refunds should you decide to not enter.
- 11. American Quilter is proposing a book about this Challenge and the use of George Mendoza's fabrics. Quilts chosen for inclusion in this publication must be available for photographing by the publisher at dates yet to be determined. Potential buyers of any quilts for sale will be so informed during the exhibit.
- 12. The top three quilts will be awarded rosettes and cash awards in the amount of \$300, \$150, and \$100. Rosettes will be awarded to Honorable Mention quilts.

May 2010 Guild Meeting: Quilt Bingo

Get ready for an evening of fun and prizes on the evening of May 25 at the White Rock Baptist Church. Based on an idea from the September/October 2006 issue of Fons and Porter's Love of Quilting magazine, we will play "Quilt Bingo" using quilt blocks that you have sewn ahead of time and buttons to cover the squares. The blocks are 2.5-inch squares organized in a 5 by 5 configuration with a black square in the middle representing the "free" square. Instead of "B", "I", "N", "G" & "O" being at the top of each column, each column will be a different color: blue, green, pink/purple, red, and yellow/orange, in that order. Within each color or column, there are 14 possible fabric types instead of numbers. The fabric types are: batik, floral, geometric, heart/butterfly, leaf, metallic/oriental, holiday, novelty, paisley, plaid, solid, star, stripe, or 1930s. Kits containing 25 2.5-inch squares with sewing instructions were available at the last guild meeting in March and will be available again at the April guild meeting. If you wish, you can use your own fabrics and, if needed, a set of instructions can be emailed to you. You can make more than one guilt block. You can bring your own buttons or some buttons will be available. We will play multiple games including any direction, horizontal only, vertical only, diagonal only, four corners and, finally, the whole block. Winners will receive prizes and the final winner will receive all the blocks -- what a wonderful scrappy quilt! There will not be a workshop for May. You Know you are a Quilter If......(from QuiltVisionUSA.com)

There's more Fabric in the House than Food
"Fat Quarters" are not the heaviest part of your body
Your ironing board is always set up but you never iron clothes
You think of your job as an interruption of your quilting time
You pet Fabric
People are always picking threads off you
You can measure a scant 1/4 by eye
"Featherweight" Doesn't mean Boxer
Your "UFO's" are not from outer space
You clean up your sewing room & they think you are leaving

Mystery Quilt Directions

Fabric requirements; 5/8 yard each for dark and medium fabrics, ³/₄ yard for light background (BG) fabric. It is up to you whether you prewash or not

When cutting, save all scraps until top is completed. Cut off all selvedges. Use ¼ inch seam throughout.

Step one uses dark and background fabric. From dark fabric cut a strip 7 ¼ by 22 ½ and then cut two 7 ½ inch squares. From BG fabric, cut a 7 ¼ by 27 inch strip and cut two 7 ¼ inch squares. Save the leftovers.

Mark a diagonal line across the back of each background square. Place a dark square, right sides together under the marked BG square. Sew a scant ¼ inch seam on each side of the line. Cut apart on the line. Iron to dark side.

Take two of the squares and place right sides together, butting the seams and lights and darks opposite each other. Draw a diagonal line across the block at a right angle to the seam. Sew a scant ¼ inch seam on each side of the line. Repeat with second set of squares. Cut on drawn line. Iron seam to one side. You should have four 6 ½ inch hourglass blocks.

Keep all blocks, fabric and scraps together.


