August 2010 Guild Meeting: Katy Korkos Tuesday, August 24 White Rock Baptist Church, 7 p.m.

A local fiber artist, Katy Korkos, will be presenting a program entitled "Finding Joy and Inspiration" for the Los Alamos Piecemakers Quilt Guild on the evening of Tuesday, August 24, at 7:00 pm at the White Rock Baptist Church. Katy is a well-known and long-time resident of Los Alamos and has shown her work regularly throughout New Mexico as well as throughout the United States since the mid-1990s. Her primary medium is fiber, which encompasses paper as well as textiles. Many of her pieces can be called studio or art quilts, with roots in traditional quilting. The common theme among much of Katy's recent work is her fascination with the iconography of birds, which, for her, "symbolizes expressiveness, song, flight, beauty, freedom, cages, nesting, the potential in an egg, living in the trees, fragility and endurance." Katy also teaches with Terry Foxx at the Pajarito Environmental Education Center on Environmentally Friendly Crafts. Her work will be shown in an upcoming show at the Johnsons Gallery in Madrid, New Mexico, beginning in mid-September. She will need everyone's help distributing them in Los Alamos, Santa Fe, and Albuquerque. Please take some flyers if you're planning a trip to any of the quilt shops in Santa Fe or Albuquerque before the Quilt Market. We'll also need members to distribute/display Quilt Market flyers at work, churches, schools, stores, community bulletin boards, etc. Talk to Margaret if you can help.

Evonne Holder has volunteered to serve as the Quilt Market Staffing Chair. (Many thanks, Evonne!) She will have sign-up sheets at the August meeting. The sheets are divided into the categories of "Things to Do" and "Things to Bring." Please sign up to help. As you know, we will need everyone's assistance to make this a successful Market. Remember that if you're going to sell items at the Quilt Market, you're required to help with either Set-up or Take-down plus work one 2-hour shift during the Market. If you sign up early, you'll get your choice of the best times/jobs.

Trish Spillman volunteered to arrange the items for sale, Please contact her if you have items that can be used to display items or to add ambiance to the Market, such as hat racks, rocking chairs, chests, plants, miniature Christmas trees, etc.

Special Quilt Market News Alert -- We've decided to use one of the church's side-rooms for selling second hand quilt-related items. Some of you may remember the Guild's "yard sale" held during the February 2010 meeting. The same concept will apply to this special room during the Quilt Market. If you have fabric, books, tools, patterns, equipment, unfinished projects, or other quilting related items that you want to sell, this will be your chance. The regular Quilt Market sales guidelines/rules will apply, so it will be a good idea to bundle like items together, if possible. Everything needs to be labeled with a Quilt Market tag and the Guild will take 15% of the sales price. Try to make it easy on the Guild Treasurer and yourself -- don't put items in for less than \$3.00. As noted previously, try to bundle things together, so we don't have a bunch of small items. Please note that we're asking you to copy the sales tags on a different color paper (green recommended) so that we can tell the second-hand items apart from the other Quilt Market items. Some extra green sales tags will be available at the August meeting.

Watch your e-mail and/or mailbox in a few weeks for a special newsletter devoted to the Quilt Market. We'll be sending out copies of General QM Information and Rules, the Inventory Sheets and Sales Tags; however, that information is currently available on the website if you need it now. Contact the Quilt Market Chair, Libby Carlsten, if you have any questions about the upcoming Market. In the meantime, keep making wonderful items to sell!

After opening Pandy was told that no fabric store in Los Alamos County had lasted longer than 5 years. It's now 11 years later and it time for a change in Pandy's life.

Mystery Quilt Directions

Step four uses medium and background fabrics. Cut three 2 ½ by width of fabric (40-42) inch strips from medium fabric. Cut twenty 2 ½ by 4 ½ inch rectangles.

Cut three BG 2 ½ by 27 inch strips. Cut them into forty 2 ½ inch squares. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the BG squares. Save the remainder of the strips.

Make flying geese by putting a marked square on the left side of the rectangle, right sides together, the line going from the center down to the left corner. Sew on the line, a scant bit on the outside of the triangle. Trim ¼ inch from the seam on the outer side of the triangle, press open. Sew, trim and press all 20. (You may discard these trimmings.)

For the second half, line up the marked square on right sides of the rectangle, right sides together with the line going from the center, down to the right on the rectangle. Sew on the line, a scant bit on the side of the outside of the triangle. Trim ¼ inch from the seam on the outer side of the triangle, press open. Sew and press all twenty, 4 ½ by 2 ½ inch flying geese blocks.

Sew geese together in four groups of nine geese. Alternate dark and medium geese; beginning and ending with medium geese. (See Photo) Set aside and wait for step 5.


