# Here are the minutes of our last meeting. A questionnaire was developed because of the discussions held that night. Please read the minutes and the questionnaire and let Fran and the board know your thoughts.

Los Alamos Piecemakers Guild Meeting, September 27, 2011, United Church Fran Suchocki called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. This meeting is to encourage new members to join and to look for new officers. Other guilds are also noting fewer members. Tonight we had 21 members attending.

**Suggestions**; Susan Roach suggested combining market and show and hosting them every other year. The year in between would be an opportunity to work on the donation quilt. She suggests fewer chairs being put out in White Rock to improve social interaction. It might be helpful to have mentors, especially for beginning quilters. Santa Fe alternates evening and daytime meetings on a monthly basis. About half of those present would find it hard to attend daytime meetings. Some members may not be able to attend evening meetings because of driving problems in the dark, and in the past carpooling has been suggested. Susan would be willing to do a questionnaire to find out what might work to improve attendance. Liz suggested a survey, but Fran only received one survey back from earlier in the year. What will happen if no one volunteers to take over in January? Susan suggested a list of each officer's duty. This has been written. The president runs the meetings. The vice-presidents plan the meetings and take care of the opening and closing of the meetings. The treasurer keeps track of the books and expenses and writes the budget. The librarian takes care of the books. Evonne will keep the books at her house this year, as the United Church will be remodeled. The secretary takes the minutes. The newsletter editor puts out a newsletter the months we have meetings. Perhaps a cluster could be responsible for a meeting. Jo Ann is willing to teach beginning quilting classes. Nicole notes that she has women in their 30s coming into her shop who want their children to learn how to sew. Liz suggested a beginning quilting class for adults. Nicole will start a newsletter and could include an advertisement for a class. Thelma suggested having a beginning quilting class with members watching the children. This may entail liability issues. Jo Ann will send a list of Albuquerque and Santa Fe speakers to the newsletter. Mickey notes that she meets with a group for beading. It is an informal meeting. But it seems we do need someone to be in charge of and organizing the meetings.

**Finances**: Last year we spent \$3800 more than we took in. We spent \$182 this year on newsletter postage so far. It would be helpful if more members used e-mail for the newsletter. Quilt market or show will cost \$2000 minimum. Shows in churches are now required to have liability insurance. We are lucky if market or the show pay for themselves. The quilt show silent auction paid for the show. We have not been earning as much from the donation quilt. We made over \$1000 on the donation quilt, but the majority of the tickets were bought at the Quilt Show. We might be able to hold meetings at the library to save money. We will have to decide how the group will be run. Joan mentioned a contact name and number for volunteers.

**New Business**: Jo Ann showed how she makes pot holders from orphan blocks. This will be the October meeting. The November meeting will be about quilt labels and a report about the Houston meeting. Joan, Fran, Susan Roach, and Christie Wilson will be on the budget committee.

Members presented quilt stories. There was show and tell and door prizes. The meeting adjourned at 8:45 pm.

### **VOLUNTEER FOR A BOARD POSITION FOR 2012 NOW!!**

The following is the description of the offices that are listed in our by-laws. But the best way to find out what is expected is to talk to the person holding that job now.

- A. The President shall preside at all Executive Committee meetings, Executive Board meetings and Guild meetings.
- B. The First Vice President shall preside at all Executive Committee meetings, Executive Board meetings and Guild meetings in the absence of the President, and shall assume the office in the event the office is vacated prior to the end of the term. In addition to these duties the First Vice President shall also head the program committee and work closely with the Second Vice President.
- C. The Second Vice President shall be in charge of workshops, shall work closely with the First Vice President, and assume the duties of the First Vice President in the event the office is vacated prior to the end of term.
- D. The Treasurer shall have custody of all Guild funds and be its general collecting, disbursing, and accounting officer.
- E. The Secretary shall take minutes of the Executive Committee meetings, Executive Board meetings and Guild meetings.
- F. No officer or Board member shall receive remuneration for serving on said Board as complies with section 501c of the Internal Revenue Code.
- G. In case of vacancy of any other office, the President shall appoint a replacement with the majority consent of the Executive Board.


