Each team will need a sewer (bring your machine), a cutter (bring mat & rotary cutter), and a presser (some irons will be available). There will be extra fabrics and batting from the Guild storage room. Even if you don't have a team, come along and join up with someone on Tuesday!

The theme of February's meeting in White Rock was **Antique Quilts and Their Stories**. Fourteen members brought quilts ranging in age from almost new to family heirlooms dating back to the early 1900's, along with stories about the women who made them and how they had been used until rescued by their current owner. The event, publicized in the LA Post, brought out non-member visitors, interested in the topic.

Reports from the Officers included a reminder from T. Hahn, **Community Service**, that the SRVP Valentine's Luncheon was set for Wed, Feb 11 at 11:30 am. Volunteers would bring either a soup, salad, bread, or desserts as well as bring quilts to show during the lunch. Librarian D McLin stated that library books will be available at the February meeting, with the list of books available on the website. Members can contact her between meetings for a specific book, which she can bring to the next meeting. She also asked for any suggestions for new books to be purchased. S Kapple, **Membership**, distributed membership cards for those who rejoined prior to last December; cards for others will be available at the February meeting. S Kuropatwinski, **Quilt Show** chair, informed us that The Crossroads Church would not officially book the event until March; she will follow up and inform the group of the exact date for the event at the next meeting.

The **President**, L Erickson, announced that the **Donation Quilt**, made and donated by Donna Smith, is already in the process of being quilted. J Williams has volunteered to head up ticket sales, etc, for the Donation Quilt. It was proposed that the **LAP web site** include a **history** of our group. Those interested in adding this feature should talk to Laura. She issued a **UFO CHALLENGE FOR 2015**, where members would log in their ufo's by description or picture, pay \$1 for each project, and participate in a drawing for completed projects at year end.
