The Checking Account Balance on June 1, 2015 was \$13,192.23 The Gross Receipts Tax filing for the period Jan 1, 2015 to June 30, 2015 was submitted

The May meeting was held in White Rock, and feature our Guild Garage Sale. Prior to the selling floor opening, Laura Erikson held the business meeting. She presented three "Thank You-s", for a quilt from Mickie Taylor given to Catherine Williams, from the Senior Quilters luncheon in February, and from the foster children who received donation quilts recently. Laura announced that the June meeting will feature a local business, Seeking Chameleon, reminded the group that there is no July meeting, and announced that in August we will make Christmas Ornaments for the first responders' dinners held at two area churches later this year. Sewing machines will be needed at the August meeting. The September meeting will be both the UFO deadline and the annual Pot Luck Dinner. October is open; suggestions are appreciated. November will see both a speaker and a workshop by Karla Alexander. Donna Smith will also hold a workshop in October on free motion techniques.

Deb McLin reported that next month she will be bringing a showcase of all new books from our Library. Dorothy Smedley reported some glitches with the May newsletter online delivery and apologized for either not getting one or getting two. Shelly Kuropatwinski announced that she confirmed the Quilt Show dates for Thursday, Sept. 24 as set up, and the show for Sept. 25 and 26. Workers are needed for set up! Joan Williams told the group that on May 2nd at Fuller Lodge, we sold \$347 in tickets for the annual Donation Quilt. She has tickets and envelopes for members who wish to sell tickets. We will again be selling tickets in August at the County Fair and will have the quilt at Santa Fe Quilting after that.

The Alzheimer's Quilt project needs volunteers to make blocks; this year the theme is houses. The blocks are due back at the June meeting.

Show and Tell featured the following: Charlene McHale, Mary Mendendorp and Linda Kolar presented a cluster project using red, white and blue fat quarters. Charlene also showed a Project Linus lap quilt made from leftovers from her bedroom quilt project. Linda Kolar's placemats were of watermelon, fall leaves and a patriotic star. Marion Good presented a quilted vest she made for her friend who painted her house. She told the group she is holding a June children's sewing class; they will make lap quilts that she hopes to show at our Quilt Show. Donna Smith presented a white, red and black crazy 9 patch, made from 3 sets of nine, with red in only 1 stack. Flo Carr showed an owl tote bag she made as a door prize for the Project Linus luncheon next month. Linda Davis showed beaded "flat dolls," whose faces were embroidered and augmented by beads. Sandra Rodriguez presented a twist and turn wall hanging she made from a door prize charm pack!

The business meeting being concluded, the members shopped at the Guild Garage Sale.
