### From Melodie Gustavsen -

I've always been a planner. As a teacher I held to the value or planning while learning to quickly adapt and change plans when my little people showed me they needed something different! So far, 2020 has turned into something we could never have planned for. Meetings and appointments have been canceled. Long-awaited trips postponed indefinitely.

All the 2020 Piecemaker plans with 3 guest speakers and a quilt market are now in question. The churches where we meet are slowly opening for services, but not to outside groups. We're adapting our plans so our meetings will keep us all safe. When we are able to meet again, we'd like to hold the meetings in Graves Hall where chairs can be placed in a large semi-circle to maintain social distancing. We'll move to online or verbal sign-ups instead of passing around a clipboard and money pouch. And we'll wear masks.

We're planning meetings for the rest of the year that focus on our talented member's experience and skills. Our own Shelly Kuropatwinski is planning a presentation of "What to Do with Pre-Cuts." Other months, we'd like to choose a different quilting technique to discuss-(such as Applique) and have members bring quilts to show where they've used that technique. If we can't have market, we might have a member's only book and yard sale to provide some fun and inspiration. And we hope to still have our yearly community sew-a-thon to make quilts for local groups. Of course, our favorite time of each meeting is "show and tell" of current finished quilts. (And with all this time at home, we will have a pretty large show and tell with all the quilts we're finishing up!)

The last few months have been stressful for me. I do like to make clear plans and living in limbo doesn't feel comfortable. I am enjoying lots of time to create. I've finished a couple more medallion quilts and have some sashiko projects lined up. I really miss our White Rock Cluster each Tuesday morning and look forward to when we can meet again.

**Round Robin Update** - Staying at home has been very positive for the Free-Spirit Exchange. Several members finished their rounds early, and we have moved to exchanging pizza boxes outside of the original schedule. (Members setting their pizza boxes outside in cars, on porches or on wood-piles, where a masked "pizza box pirate" exchanged them for a new box.) Most members are on Round 4. At our next meeting (June or August?), some members will finish and we can reveal their quilt tops. Other members have the option of completing a Round 5 before opening their boxes in front of the group.

We've seen some really great tops in process and been creatively challenged by this experience. It's getting harder and harder to wait and see the final results!

**Individual Medallion Challenge** – I've continued to have fun making medallion quilts and hope you are too. (Since I'll be choosing prizes for this challenge, I won't be joining the competition). We are still planning to conclude this challenge in October and the whole group will vote on the completed quilts.

### From Clara Vigil

Definitely, this time has been challenging for me and at the same time very busy and inspirational. I've learned a lot about myself, the meaning of community and that angels do exist.

It all started at the beginning of our shelter in place mandate. Together with Shelley we decided to make masks for our medical community starting small with MANNM. I sent out a request for help to the guild members and Shelley sent out a notice to her customers. Hours later Pam Hundley contacted me because she had a small group of sewers that were helping her make masks for MANNM. What started off as a small project grew like the Covid-19 disease. The "Mask Makers" quickly turned into the "Sew Many Masks" which was a true representation of the many, many masks that we made.

The response that I got from the guild members was amazing. I would like to thank everyone who participated in this project, whether you sewed, donated materials, or helped spread the word. Thank you! Thank you!! The "Sew Many Masks" group donated 3,300 masks, 83 scrub caps, and were ready to make gowns for the hospital. (I was told today this may still happen.) I met some wonderful people through this group. Although, I don't have a face to put with every name that contacted me.

As I think of all the outreach work our guild has been involved in this year, I am honored to be part of such an amazing, caring group of women. This quote describes our group, "Women Stand Strong!"
